Survey Validity

Studies of surveys similar to the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) that check substance use responses against actual drug tests have shown substantial validity. In addition, the patterns of use revealed by the IYS are consistent with other measures such as differential treatment rates for different substances. The survey provides valid statewide estimates of alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use. Data collection processes are closely monitored to address limitations whenever possible and to screen for inconsistencies in the self-report.

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Survey Significance



The Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) is a statewide survey administered to students in the 8th, 10th and 12th grades.

The IYS includes questions about a number of health-related behaviors and measures key risk and protective factors that strongly contribute to community-wide substance use rates among youth.







Percentage of students who have *consumed alcohol* in the *past year*




Percentage of students who have used marijuana in the past year




Percentage of students who think there is a *moderate to great risk* of harming yourself if you use *marijuana once or twice a week*

Percentage of students who say it would be **sort of easy** to **very easy** to get some **marijuana**
















Percentage of students whose *parents/guardians always* or *most of the time* know *where* they are at and *who* they are with when not at home




Percentage of students (who identified as using alcohol in the past year) who got their *beer, wine, or liquor* from their *parents <u>WITH</u> their permission*










35% of students ate *fruits* and *vegetables* at least *once per day or more* during the past week 72%


of students were *physically active* for at least a total of *60 minutes* on *4 or more days* during the past week

On an average school day, approximately **8 out of 10** students spend an average of **2 or more hours** on **NON-SCHOOL related screen time** such as TV, gaming, texting, and social media.

By comparison, a *healthy goal* for daily screen time is **2** or less hours.
