Take Care of Your Kidneys

Kidneys filter and remove several toxic materials from the body that are the products of food metabolism. The kidneys are two bean-shaped organs, located below the ribs toward the middle of the back. They remove liquid waste from the blood in the form of urine and keep a stable balance of chemicals, such as salts and other substances in the blood. Kidney disease progresses slowly and generally without any symptoms for years.

"Frequently people discover their kidneys are only working at 30 or 40 percent of their capacity and have no idea they have kidney disease," says SBL Internal Medicine/ Nephrologist, Antonios Papadopoulos, MD.

"People should have their kidney function and urine tested every year, even if they feel fine. Those with high blood pressure and diabetes have a much higher incidence of kidney disease and should absolutely have an annual test. Uncontrolled diabetes and high blood pressure can lead to severe kidney disease and kidney failure, requiring weekly dialysis," Papadopoulos explained.

The vast majority of patients have no symptoms until the diseased is advanced. These may include:

- Fatigue
- Itchiness all over the body
- Blood in the urine
- Loss of appetite
- Nausea and vomiting
- Puffiness around eyes, swelling of hands and feet
- Skin may darken
- Pain in small of back just below the ribs
- High blood pressure

Tilt Table Test

Testing for Fainting

The Heart Center now has a special tilt table test to help determine why someone faints or becomes lightheaded. Cardiologist B. Lakshmi, MD, monitors the non-invasive test that takes about 60 minutes

to complete. The table slowly changes positions from standing up to lying down, while heart rate and blood pressure are monitored. Talk to your primary care provider to see if this test may help you.



Jesse Butler, MD Spine Surgeon

For Jesse Butler, MD, hard work is all he's ever known. Having grown up on a farm in Western Illinois, he worked long days along side his dad on land that has been in his family since the late 1800s.

After graduating high school in a class of 35 students, he went to college in Dallas, entered



medical school at UHS/The Chicago Medical School and found that he really loved orthopedic surgery.

While he started his career at an orthopedic practice in Chicago, Dr. Butler moved to Monticello nearly 10 years ago to be near his son, who was a walk-on member of the Fighting Illini football team.

Today, Dr. Butler focuses his busy practice on spine surgery. "My niche in spine surgery is in failed surgeries. I've taken care of many, many people who have had disappointing outcomes somewhere else, and I've been able to help them," Dr. Butler said.

Dr. Butler, along with one of his associates, Neurosurgeon Pradeep Narotam, MD, are providing spine care at SBL Orthopedic and Sports Medicine.

Dr. Butler relates easily to his patient population because he understands the physical demands on their bodies. "I know the physical work that people around here do, since that's how I grew up, and there's still a lot of manufacturing in the area. They have rough and tumble lives, and they have a certain level of function that is mandated by their work," he said.

Dr. Butler understands that some procedures won't work for everyone. He won't recommend a procedure if it means they won't be able to put food on the table for their families.

Pfizer Bivalent vaccine COVID Booster FAQ

Who can get the COVID booster?

The Pfizer Bivalent vaccine is available to those 12 years and older.

When can I get the new COVID booster?

It can be administered two months after the last booster or series of vaccines.

My previous vaccines were not Pfizer, can I get this booster? Yes. This booster can be given to those who had Moderna or Johnson & Johnson vaccines or boosters.

Should I get boosted if I've already had COVID-19?

Yes. People with a prior COVID-19 infection are eligible, but should wait until they've fully recovered from acute illness and are out of isolation.

Where can I get the booster at Sarah Bush Lincoln?

The booster is available at the Charleston, Effingham or Mattoon Walk-In vlinics. No appointment is needed. See the front page for clinic hours.

New Technology in the Operating Room **Da Vinci Robot Surgery**



Sarah Bush Lincoln has recently introduced the use of a da Vinci robot. Robotic surgery has many advantages for patients, including smaller incisions and reduced recovery times. At Sarah Bush Lincoln, the da Vinci surgical system gives the surgeon 100 percent control of the robotic-assisted system, which translates his or her hand

movements into smaller, more precise movements of tiny instruments inside the patient's body.

The system can be used for colorectal procedures, hernia repair, gallbladder surgery, gynecology and bariatric surgery. Currently General Surgeon Todd Bierman, MD, and OB-GYNs Scott Meyer, MD, and Ashton Ballinger, MD, are using the da Vinci system.

In orthopedics, the Mako Robotic Arm is used for partial and total hip and knee replacement surgeries.

The robotic-assisted surgery is so successful because the CT scan and the Mako work in concert to effectively limit bone and soft tissue trauma. It has proven to be less painful and to provide a faster recovery than other manual replacement procedures.



Spine surgery has become more precise with the use of a CT-guided spinal navigation system. Sarah Bush Lincoln Neurosurgeons Emilo Nardone, MD, and Pradeep Narotam, MD and Orthopedic Spine Surgeon Jesse Butler, MD, use this technology.

The CT is used in the operating room to align the patient, giving surgeons a precise 3-D view of the spine. It makes recommendations on screw size and placement and helps guide the planning and placement of the screws. It calculates the length and width of the screw to fit exact or the next smallest screw size. In fact, it allows the surgeon to place the screws virtually prior to the actual insertion to help the surgeon validate the placement.
