SBL Opens State-of-the-Art Heart Center

Sarah Bush Lincoln is pleased to provide state-of the-art cardiac care close to home in its new Heart Center, which opened in early October.

The Heart Center offers a full range of cardiovascular services including diagnostic testing, treatments, screening programs, disease management and prevention. It is staffed by medical and interventional cardiologists with Prairie Heart Institute of Illinois. Some of the cardiologists have sub-specialties in electrophysiology and women's cardiovascular health expertise that would normally require people from rural areas to travel to larger organizations for care.

The new Heart Center consolidates cardiac services that were located in different parts of the Health Center and it includes the addition of a second cardiac cath lab, 15 exam rooms for the cardiac and pulmonary clinics, rehab gym for Monitored Exercise Testing Services (METS), stress testing, echocardiograms, pulmonary function testing, EKG and nuclear medicine.

The second floor houses 21 private medical surgical rooms that are equipped to monitor patients on telemetry. The entire addition is connected to each adjacent floor of the Health Center, including a new elevator going to the third and fourth floors.

Erica Stollard, director of Planning, explained that through a partnership with Prairie Heart Institute of Illinois, the volume of cardiology services has grown greatly in the last few years. Interventional Cardiologist Amit Dande, MD, Cardiologists Michael LaMonto, DO, and Jason Trager, DO, and Allison Gough, APRN, currently staff The Heart Center. Cardiologist Thomas Cahill, MD, recently resigned his position at Sarah Bush Lincoln to work closer to home.

The addition features a drive-up canopied entrance (Entrance H) with a glass and metal façade on the west side and brick on the south and east sides.

Healthy Recipe

Oven Baked Salmon

INGREDIENTS

12 ounce salmon fillet, cut into 4 pieces Coarse-grained salt Freshly ground black pepper Toasted Almond Parsley Salad

Baked squash, for serving, optional

Toasted Almond Parsley Salad

1 shallot

1 tablespoons red wine vinegar

Coarse-grain salt

2 tablespoons capers, rinsed

1 cup fresh flat-leaf parsley

1/2 cup toasted almonds

Extra-virgin olive oil

DIRECTIONS

(for serving)

- 1. Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F.
- 2. Season salmon with salt and pepper. Place salmon, skin side down, on a non-stick baking sheet or in a non-stick pan with an oven-proof handle. Bake until salmon is cooked through, about 12 to 15 minutes. Serve with the Toasted Almond Parsley Salad and squash, if desired.

Toasted Almond Parsley Salad

- 3. Mince the shallot and add to a small bowl. Pour the vinegar over the shallots and add a pinch of salt. Let sit for 30 minutes.
- 4. Roughly chop the capers, parsley and almonds and add to the shallots. Add the olive oil, tasting as you go. Mix again and adjust the seasonings.

Women's Imaging Center Enhanced for Greater Privacy

Fear is such a strong motivator that it can prevent people from doing the right thing. In fact, the fear of having a mammogram can be so great for women – due to worry that it will be painful, embarrassing, or that it may reveal cancer or another problem – that they sometimes avoid it all together.

For those reasons, Sarah Bush Lincoln has transformed the mammography experience in

the newly opened Women's Imaging Center, with the hope that more women will have annual mammograms.

The center, located on the first floor of the Health Center near the Gift Shop, allows women to bypass general registration and check in there. Spacious dressing rooms allow women to change and then relax in private, comfortable waiting areas before their scans.

All mammography units feature tomosynthesis, or 3D scanning, the most advanced technology available in the detection of breast cancer. Clinically proven to significantly increase the detection of breast cancers, tomosynthesis also decreases the number of women who are asked to return for additional testing.

"This 3D technology reveals invasive breast cancers in 41 percent more people than traditional 2D mammography reveals," Stacia Goings, director of SBL Diagnostic Imaging, said. "We are excited to provide advanced care to our



patients to give them the best chance of survival." The same technology soon will be available on a new mobile mammography van.

In conventional 2D mammography, overlapping tissue is a leading reason why small breast cancers may be missed and why normal tissue may appear abnormal – a common cause of unnecessary callbacks, she explained. The three-dimensional imagining that tomosynthesis offers can greatly reduce the impact of tissue overlap.

Along with the 3D technology, the Women's Imaging Center is equipped with curved paddles to offer greater comfort during exams. The center also offers DEXA scans (a technology that measures bone density and body composition) and breast ultrasound biopsy services if needed.

The Women's Imaging Center's breast nurse navigator, Retha Garver, RN, helps women, who have suspicious scans and breast cancer diagnoses, navigate next steps. Her support and guidance is invaluable for many women, especially those who do not have a strong or local support system. Garver accompanies women to tests and doctor visits, serves as a "second set of ears" and even interprets medical information so women better understand their options and can make informed choices.

Walk-In Clinic and Primary Care Office Opens in Effingham

Sarah Bush Lincoln opened a Walk-In Clinic and a primary care office in its SBL Effingham Clinic at 905 N. Maple Ave., Effingham, in January.

The Walk-In Clinic is staffed by Family Physician Douglas Kabbes, MD, a lifelong resident of Effingham. It is open from 10 am to 8 pm, Monday through Friday. Its hours will be extended as its use warrants it.

Dr. Kabbes has been caring for people at Family Medical Center in Mattoon for the last year. Internal Medicine Physician Marisa Friscia, MD, is now caring for Dr. Kabbes' patients at Family Medical Center.

Effingham resident Louis Schwing, MD, opened an internal medicine practice at the same clinic on January 2. Dr. Schwing will care for people age 16 and older.

Dr. Kabbes worked for many years in Emergency Medicine, caring for a wide array of acute issues and illnesses.

A walk-in clinic cares for people of all ages who have minor medical problems including colds, sore throats, ear infections, cuts, sprains and strains. It also offers diagnostic services such as X-ray and simple blood and urine tests. It is not intended to treat chronic conditions or serious medical conditions. Babies must be at least three months old without a fever or six months old with a fever to receive care at the clinic. People are treated on a first-come, first-served basis. Anyone with a life-threatening injury or illness like shortness of breath, and chest pains should go to the nearest emergency department.

People may check **www.sarahbush.org** to check Walk-In Clinic wait times. The Effingham Walk-In Clinic phone number is **217 540-6123**. The cost of a walk-in clinic visit is approximately the same as a physician office visit. Sarah Bush Lincoln also has walk-in clinics in Mattoon, Charleston and Tuscola.

Dr. Schwing began his career as an internal medicine physician and gained vast experience as a hospitalist at HSHS St. Anthony and at Sarah Bush Lincoln. He said he is excited getting back to a medical practice where he can build long-term relationships with his patients.

"I think I'm a good listener and I spend a fair amount of time with patients to get to know their stories and to put together their problems," Dr. Schwing said. "It's amazing what people will open up and tell you if you have a good connection and they feel comfortable."

"It's certainly not a one-way conversation," he added. "Patients have a voice in the way their treatment options are pursued. I think of myself as a consultant."

Free Colon Cancer Screen

Colon cancer is treatable in its earliest stages, and periodic screenings are needed for early detection. A limited number of free Hemosure colon cancer screening kits are available on a first-come first-served basis. This easy-to-do free screen is non-invasive and has a 97 percent accuracy rate!

Who should be screened?

- People between 50 to 75 years old
- People with a strong family history of colon cancer
- People who have never had a colonoscopy
- People with the following symptoms:
 - Diarrhea / Constipation
 - Rectal bleeding
 - Black or tarry stools
 - Weight loss / Bloating
 - Change in bowel habits

What is involved with the screen?

The kit you receive allows you to easily collect a stool sample in a plastic container. You return it discreetly in a brown bag to any Sarah Bush Lincoln clinics or the hospital outpatient lab. Tests should be returned to Sarah Bush Lincoln by March 29, 2019.

How will I receive the result?

If your test result is negative, you will receive a letter in the mail from the Sarah Bush Lincoln Gastroenterology Clinic. If your test result is positive, you will receive a phone call from the SBL Gastroenterology Clinic, and a certified letter alerting you to the results and the actions you should take for further investigation.


